Dr. Shari Ling

Dr. Shari M. Ling is the Deputy Chief Medical Officer for the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), and Medical Officer in the Center for Clinical Standards and Quality. She assists the CMS Chief Medical Officer in the Agency's pursuit of better health care, healthier populations, and smarter spending.

Dr. Wes Ely, the Grant W. Liddle Chair in Medicine, is a sub specialist in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine who conducts patient-oriented, health services research as a Professor of Medicine in the Division of Allergy, Pulmonary, and Critical Care Medicine at Vanderbilt University Medical Center in Nashville, TN. He is also a practicing intensivist with a focus on Geriatric ICU Care, as the Associate Director for Research for the VA Tennessee Valley Geriatric Research and Education Clinical Center.



Dr. Donna Fick

Donna Marie Fick, PhD, RN, GCNS-BC, FAAN is a Distinguished Professor in The Pennsylvania State University College of Nursing, the Elouise Ross Eberly Endowed Professor of Nursing, and Director of the Center for Geriatric Nursing Excellence. Her area of research has focused on inappropriate medication use and delirium superimposed on dementia (DSD). She is nationally and internationally recognized as a leading expert in geriatric care and research.



Sunday Workshops 8:00am - 12:00pm

Basic Science Workshop

Suggested Attendees: Participants to have a basic knowledge of animal modeling and/or research.

The Basic Science Workshop is aimed at advancing delirium research by critically examining current animal models and identifying future research directions. Participants will explore the complexities of replicating delirium in animal studies, discussing challenges such as defining delirium and modeling different subtypes in animals, and developing appropriate behavioral and physiological markers. Key objectives include establishing research priorities, developing a shared language for delirium research, and exploring innovative approaches to better understand the mechanisms of delirium. The workshop will conclude with a panel discussion and Q&A session to synthesize insights and chart future research strategies in this critical field.

ADS-NIDUS Grant Writing Workshop

Suggested Attendees: Participants will submit a draft Specific Aims page prior to the conference that will serve as an educational template throughout the workshop.

The ADS-NIDUS Grant Writing Workshop aims to enhance the skills of delirium researchers at all career stages as they prepare proposals for federal, foundational, or other funding opportunities. This four-hour workshop, led by experienced delirium researchers, will incorporate a mix of short instructional lectures and mentored small group discussions. The focus will be primarily on the critical elements necessary to develop a strong aims page and ensure its alignment with the overall research proposal. Prior to the workshop, attendees will be required to submit a draft of their aims page, which will serve as an educational template throughout the session. More information will be provided soon.

Foundations of Delirium Assessment and Management

Suggested Attendees: Early learners and caregivers yearning to bolster their current understanding and clinical assessment skills or educators searching for opportunities to enhance resources for learners.

The Foundations of Delirium workshop is an immersive 4-hour journey through the complexities of delirium across the lifespan. Co-hosted by the American Delirium Society (ADS) and Vanderbilt University School of Nursing (VUSN), this workshop offers hands-on experience with realistic patient scenarios in settings such as the acute care/ICU, pediatrics, and long-term care. Participants will engage with various delirium assessment tools, enhancing their diagnostic acumen. The program also delves into the identification of delirium risk factors and equips healthcare professionals with robust management strategies.

Rising to the Next Level - Optimizing Interdisciplinary Delirium Care

Suggested Attendees: Learners, clinicians, educators with a solid foundation in delirium assessment wanting to advance their understanding of delirium assessment and management.

This next level workshop will elevate your baseline knowledge to incorporate interdisciplinary care and highlight non-pharmacologic strategies for the management of delirium. Goals include describing optimal strategies to assimilate patient assessment, communication and family engagement with multidisciplinary interventions. In this workshop, evidence-based interventions highlighting physical therapy and occupational therapy in addition to other non-pharmacologic strategies will be discussed. Furthermore, the beneficial outcomes of collaborative assessment and management of delirium will be demonstrated using case scenarios, video demonstrations and audience participation.
